### Who we are

iaOBERfcs was founded on June 25<sup>th</sup>, 2003, by the Fondazione Emanuela Zancan and Boston College in partnership with 28 experts from around the world. Since then, an annual international seminar has been organized, where members can present their research. Whenever possible, the annual seminar is linked to a research dissemination event; this event is open to professionals and to the scholarly community. In the past, seminars have been held in New Zealand (Wellington), Italy (Volterra, Malosco, Padova, Venice, Rome), the United States (Boston, New York), the UK (Oxford), Israel (Jerusalem), Spain (Oviedo) and Hong Kong (China). Nowadays, the Association's headquarters is located in Padova, Italy, at Via del Seminario 5/A. The Association, in order to promote evaluation of services for children and families, pursues the following aims: to promote cross-national research and comparisons on theories, methods, and techniques for outcome-based evaluation and research; to facilitate the exchange of experiences and knowledge on these subjects through meetings, seminars, and international workshops, as well as using publications and sharing knowledge through the web; to conduct research and studies on outcome-based evaluation; and to disseminate the findings of the aforementioned experimentation and research. In 2023, the Association is celebrating its 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary with an international conference open to professionals and researchers working with children, adolescents and families. The primary goals of this conference are to share international research findings along with other learnings, and to propose improvements in services for children and families. Presentations by members of the International Association will provide a space for reflection on the evaluation of outcomes in child and family services. The Association is also actively inviting practitioners and researchers to document their experiences in the field. We believe that sharing those experiences can make an important contribution to the search fo

- Who can participate? It is opened to all conference participants (practitioners and researchers in different disciplines, as individuals or in groups).
- How can you participate? By sending a short paper of up to 12,000 characters, in Italian or English, to the email <a href="mailto:iaober@iaober.org">iaober@iaober.org</a> [author(s) and affiliation, key words (3-5), aim, method, results and outcomes, conclusion, main references]
- On which theme focus the articles? The choice of topic and text to be published must be consistent with the general theme of the Conference indicated above. You can present the results of your own research and/or deepen methodological issues relevant to the evaluation of outcome and the development of social, health, educational professions on evaluation issues.
- When can you compete? By 31st July 2023.
- When does the selection take place? After July 31st, the selection phase begins, which will end on September 20th.
- What selection criteria are established? Short papers worthy of being valued for originality and quality of content will be selected.
- When will the results be announced? During the conference the titles and authors of the selected contributions will be announced, together with the timing and procedures of publication in a Special Issue of the journal Studi Zancan.
